If you have a job, you also need a Work Permit. It's against the law for a minor to work without a Work Permit in California. Work permits must be obtained at the start of a new job and renewed at the start of each new school year. *All current work permits expire on or before Friday, August 19th, and must be renewed.*

Students who have a job may be eligible to enroll in Work Experience Education, an elective course which combines paid employment with classroom instruction. Work Experience students meet with Ms. Yescas, our Work Experience Coordinator, once a week at school and can earn up to 10 credits per semester and a total of 20 credits per year. If you are interested in finding a job, Ms. Yescas can assist you with job leads, creating a resume, and developing the skills you need to get and keep a job.

If you need to renew your work permit or would like more information about Work Experience Education, stop by main office to see Ms. Yescas before school, during lunch or after school. The Work Experience office has moved and is now located in the Counseling Center, across from Mrs. Klopstock.
