OUR SCHOOL

Built in 1941, Edison High School has served the surrounding community for generations. We are located in the California Central Valley in the south part of Stockton. Our student population is approximately 2,550 students and represents the diversity of our community. We have 84.8 % Socioeconomically Disadvantaged, 24% English Learners and 12% students with disabilities. In 2021 our graduation rate was 82.5%.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Edison High School is an AVID national demonstration school and we have received AVID certification for the last ten years. Demonstration status is awarded to less than one percent of schools nationally. Additionally we have implemented a Project Lead The Way (PLTW) program in Engineering.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

Edison has been on a block schedule with two terms of 40 credits each with a total of 80 credits possible in a school-year.

CURRICULUM

Courses offered include grade level, honors, Advanced Placement and in some cases Community College courses taught on our campus and on-line. Honors courses include: algebra, geometry, algebra II, English I, English II, biology, chemistry, physics, world history and US history

AP Courses Offered include: Calculus AB and BC (not every year), English language, English literature, Studio 2-D Art and Design, US Government, world history, Spanish Language

Dual enrollment with our local community college has increased and as a result our enrollment in AP classes has fallen. AP testing results for 2022:

169 students tested, 14 scored a 3, 10 scored a 4 and 9 scored a 5. the rest did not pass.

COLLEGE ATTENDANCE

55% of the class of 2019 enrolled in college the Fall immediately after high school. Only 45% of the class of 2020 and 39% of the class of 2021 largely due to the pandemic. The majority of our college-bound students enroll in a 2-year institution. In the class of 2021 12% of our graduating class attended a 4-year institution.
