Initial licensure programs.

Bachelor of Arts in Special Education-Mild to Moderate (BASPMM) and Elementary Education (BASPEE)

Teaches students how to deal with behavior management, collaboration skills with colleagues and families, and how to meet student needs. BASPEE offers dual licensure opportunities in elementary and special education.

Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education (BAELED)

Equips teachers with the content knowledge and teaching skills needed to run an elementary school classroom.

Master of Arts in Teaching-Elementary Education (MATELED)

Prepares students at the graduate level to be licensed as K–8 educators with significant skills in curriculum, instruction, and assessment.

STEM programs that lead to teacher licensure.

Pre-service and existing teachers pursuing initial licensure or endorsement or looking to add an M.A. emphasis to their licenses.



Core courses for initial licensure.

A series of eight courses that will give students the essential foundation and experience needed to prepare them to handle unique situations and become better teachers.

Educational Foundations

Allows for the relevancy and application of historical context and cultural influences and is not focused on the memorization of facts and theory.

Educational Psychology and Development of Children and Adolescents

Integrates the principles of educational psychology in relation to child/adolescent development and focuses on applying philosophies and theories rather than memorization.

The School as a Community of Care

Supports students with varying needs, focusing on understanding the social-emotional learning (SEL) components and weaving the theme of family engagement throughout the course. The curriculum moves beyond school-level resources and includes community-based resources for support at home and beyond.

Fundamentals of Diverse Learners

Utilizes the resources and themes learned in the community of care course—including a live simulated experience—and provides specific strategies to target the needs of diverse populations and individuals.

Managing Engaging Learning Environment

Provides the foundation of knowledge for developing curriculum, delivering instruction, and assessing learning. The connection between the three components is emphasized to ensure relevant, engaging lessons.

Assessing Impact on Student Learning

Develops authentic assessments to ensure standards are being met and how to use that data to make instructional decisions.

Educational Technology for Teaching and Learning

Focuses on how to choose the correct technology, authentically implement it in the classroom, and use it to transform learning and assessment.

Demonstration Teaching (DT)

Covers competencies required for in-classroom proficiency and is a full-time, supervised, in-classroom experience that integrates academic knowledge and teaching skills.

Affordable Tuition

Tuition for this program is charged at a flat rate once per sixmonth term, regardless of the number of courses you complete. Federal financial aid and scholarships are available to qualified students. This affordable tuition allows many students to graduate with little or no new student debt.
