

Ten Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) Edition #19 2024-25 School Year – Week of January 6, 2025 Questions are quoted as I received them directly from our community.

1. What is the Specialty School Fair I keep hearing about? Is that the same as CTE? The Specialty School Fair is an event designed to showcase our district's 19 specialty school programs, which include a wide range of offerings such as automotive, agriculture, healthcare, music, and more. It's separate from CTE but complements it by highlighting unique educational pathways and opportunities available to students.

This year, the Specialty School Fair will be held alongside the STEAM Fair at the same location, making it convenient for students, staff, and families to explore both events. There will be demonstrations, staff available to answer questions, and on-site registration for programs.

2. My son is preparing his project for the STEAM Fair. What will be happening during that event?

Attendees will also enjoy interactive "make-and-take" science activities and have the unique opportunity to explore the wonders of the StarLab Planetarium. 3. How do I register for the STA Professional Development Day? What will be offered?

4. Do all equity team members need to attend the Equity Kick-off on January 24th, considering it is also a PD day?

We understand that some members may have conflicting commitments, but we strongly encourage as many team members as possible to attend. This event is a crucial step in our equity journey, and your participation is essential in shaping the future of this important work.

5. At the welcome back assembly you mentioned the district would be providing students with two Chromebooks, one that stays at school and one that can be kept at home. I and our Math Department teachers were so excited to hear that we would be getting Chromecarts back in our classrooms to house the Chromebooks that are to remain at school. What is the timeframe for delivery?

All Chromebooks for the district's 2-to-1 Chromebook initiative have been successfully delivered. During the most recent principals' meeting, it was noted that principals can coordinate with the Technology and Innovation team to purchase additional Chromebook carts if needed. Most school sites already have sufficient carts to store their Chromebooks, and several have worked with Technology and Innovation to acquire additional carts as necessary. If your school site requires more Chromebook carts, please inform your principal so they can collaborate with the Technology and Innovation team to address your needs.

6. I thought you supported Athletics, was their budget cut this year?

Athletics play a vital role in fostering students' passions, interests, and talents while promoting their overall success. I recognize the profound impact that sports have on enhancing school engagement, improving attendance, and cultivating essential life skills such as teamwork, discipline, and resilience. Since my arrival, the athletic budget has increased annually to meet the need of the program, reflecting my commitment to supporting the development of the Whole Child and ensuring they have the resources to thrive both on and off the field.

8. Can you provide me a listing of all of the days off for the students in the next month or so that will allow me to plan?

9. Do Intervention Teachers receive the \$500 as well for supplies?

Yes, intervention teachers are included in the list of certificated staff eligible to receive the \$500 allocation for supplies and materials. They should follow the same established process as other staff members to order their materials.

10. Hello Dr, Rodriguez, as a parent we are curious if there is ever a plan to return our 9-12 general education students to the SUSD Yellow School bus? There are ongoing safety concerns with our students riding the RTD city bus to and from school. Thank you.
