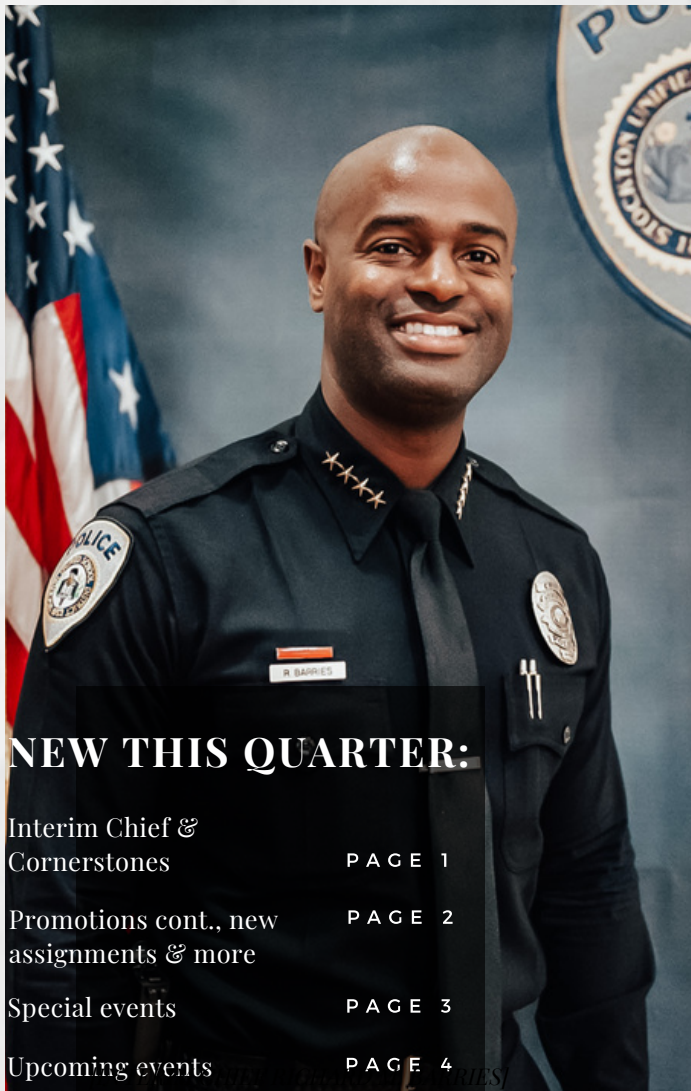

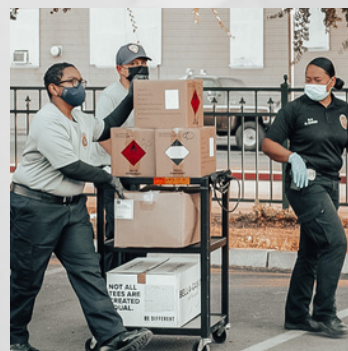
### K-9 LUKE & OFC. BHARDWAJ VISIT CHIMINIKE'S PRESCHOOL
