

Link Their Scores with Khan Academy® for Official SAT Practice

When students connect their College Board and Khan Academy accounts, they'll get personalized practice plans based on their PSAT/NMSQT scores.

- 1 Visit satpractice.org**
Create an account on Khan Academy or sign in to an existing account.
- 2 Link their accounts**
When prompted, agree to link their Khan Academy and College Board accounts.
- 3 Send their test results**
Log in to their College Board account and hit **Send** to get a personalized practice plan.

Explore Careers

When students log in to see their scores, they can connect with **Roadmap to Careers**, found under the **Popular Tools** tab. After answering questions about what they like to do, students will find out which careers match their interests, what degrees they'll need, and what high school courses they should be taking. They can also watch video interviews with real people in related professions.

Find Out About Their AP® Potential

Taking challenging classes is another great way to prepare for college. The AP Potential section of a student's score report shows which AP classes they're likely to succeed in. You can use this information to speak to your students about the benefits of AP.
