Provides ongoing parent trainings and workshops, parent gatherings to promote networking and support, a variety of informational resources, and more.

SERVICES

The Medical Therapy Program of CCS provides physical & occupational therapy, and physician oversight to physically disabled children in need of habilitation or rehabilitation services – pays for medical care, equipment, & rehabilitation for authorized individuals.

SERVICES

Provides services, training, and advocacy to individuals with developmental disabilities and their families.

SERVICES

Provides information, tools, and resources to people who are blind and visually impaired to achieve their full potential.

SERVICES

Provides services and advocacy resulting in employment, independent living, and equality for individuals with disabilities.

SERVICES

Serves families raising children, age birth to 22 years, with special needs.

SERVICES

Supports children and families in need of social support and training services.

SERVICES

Through University of the Pacific, a full speech and language diagnostic evaluation is conducted and free speech and language therapy is offered to children 12 months to 18 years of age who are determined eligible.

Through individualized services, supports people with developmental disabilities.
