<u>Willie B. Adkins program</u> - a program for historically under-served students with a strong focus on college, career and community readiness

<u>Project Lead the Way</u> - pathways in computer science, engineering, and biomedical science engage students in hands-on activities, projects, and problems; empower them to solve real-world challenges

<u>A-G College Requirements</u> - a sequence of high school courses that students must complete to be minimally eligible for admission to the University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU).

<u>Collegeboard / The SAT Test</u> - The SAT is an entrance exam used by most colleges and universities to make admissions decisions

FAFSA Application - apply for financial aid

<u>California Dream Act</u> - allows undocumented and nonresident documented students who meet certain provisions to apply for and receive private scholarships
