The After School Education and Safety (ASES) program is the result of the 2002 voter-approved initiative, Proposition 49. This proposition amended California Education Code (EC) Section 8482 to expand and rename the former Before and After School Learning and Safe Neighborhood Partnerships Program. The ASES Program funds the establishment of local after school education and enrichment programs. These programs are created through partnerships between schools and local community resources to provide literacy, academic enrichment and safe constructive alternatives for students in transitional kindergarten through ninth grade.



Where we are now ELOP TK-6th

The Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP) was established beginning in fiscal year 2021–22 by Assembly Bill (AB) 130, Chapter 44, Statutes of 2021.

The purpose of these funds is for school districts to provide out of school enrichment programs for grades kindergarten through sixth grade (TK/K-6) and as described in California Education Code Section 46120. These safe and learning enrichment programs should be offered to all students and given the opportunity to attend *before school, after school, intercession, and summer programs.* Student enrollment is based on staffing.

California Department of Education (CDE), reconigzes that both programs have merged as one, Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP). ELOP is now a more comprehensive program and has added 30 non-instructional days of programming to the school year for our SUSD students. ELOP provides programming for before school, after-school, intersession, and summer programs. We are able to offer a safe place that administers more mental health, health, and social emotional wellness to our students. In addition to providing academic support and tutoring to our students, ELOP will continue to work with our community based partners to incorporate sports, intramurals, field trips, the arts, financial literacy, and overall robust enrichment programming.






