NATIVE AMERICAN POWWOW DANCERS



Dae'yanna St. Mary is Chactaw, Blackfoot, and Mescalero Apache. Dae'yanna was 2018 Stockton Winter Powwow Tiny Tot Girl. As part of head staff Dae'yanna had many responsibilities. Throughout the powwow the Head Dancers are the first to begin each dance. They also assist with specials and honoring's and lead the honor dances. They serve as role models and must be very knowledgeable about the traditional songs, dances, honoring's, and other powwow events. Dae'yanna carries on the traditions of her mother, grandmother, cousins and aunties .

Brandon Vanderpool is Yakama and Cherokee. Brandon is the youngest member of the Stockton Community UOP Powwow Committee. He attends every meeting and is always the first person to volunteer to help. He is also a member of the Young Eagle Spirit Dance and Drum Group. He goes to every practice and helps the new dancers and drummers that come out to learn. Brandon is shaping up to be real leader in the community and an amazing role model.



Juliet Cervantes is Apache and Navajo. Juliet is a 13 year old traditional Jingle Dancer. Her mother and grandmother made her dress in the traditional way. Juliet loves the powwow and enjoys the opportunity to dance and be with her community. She hopes to one day be nominated as Head Girl but knows that it is a lot of responsibility and a big commitment. Juliet is in the seventh grade and loves learning about her culture.

Jose Talamontes is member of the Young Eagle Spirit Dance and Drum Group. Young Eagle Spirit Dance and Drum travel around San Joaquin County and sharing their culture with the community and schools. Jose is currently in the fourth grade. He loves traveling and dancing . Jose was featured in the Record at the last Stockton Community UOP Winter Powwow. Jose was quoted saying dancing in our traditional ways "It's like a gift ... we dance for our ancestors and our culture"

RECIPE



Sweet Potato Salsa and Baked Fries

Ingredients

- 4 medium sweet potatoes
- 4 scallions or one large sweet onion
- 3 raw jalapenos or 1/2 c pickled ones. If you use raw ones, remove the seeds
- 1 red bell pepper, chopped and sautéed
- 1-2 large tomatoes (optional)
- *Cumin to taste
- Chili powder to taste
- Black pepper and salt to taste
- *Garlic to taste
- *Juice of 1 lime (for salsa only)

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Peel the potatoes and finely dice. Or pulse into a rough chop. If you want fries, cut into strips, like a French fries

In a large bowl, put chopped potatoes and spices, drizzle olive oil on top then mix. If making Fries, it is easier to put them in a baggy and shake with oil, pepper, cayenne, cumin, etc.

Spread potatoes onto cookie sheet and bake for 20 minutes or until tender. Meanwhile, put jalapenos, sautéed red pepper and chopped tomato in food processor, or chop finely with knife.

Salsa: After potatoes are done, gently mix all ingredients together in one large bowl. Pour lime juice over the top. Taste and add spices as needed. Refrigeration is optional.

Fries: These are done. No need to add anything else.


