Inter-District Attendance

(IDA) 2018—2019

It is that time of the year, if you live outside of Stockton Unified School District (SUSD) you must complete the Inter-District Transfer Request form for the 2018-2019 school year, which is available at your home district.

The primary factors considered are the attendance, behavior and academic history of the student and/or the space available in the requested school/program.

IDA's must be received at Child Welfare and Attendance (CWA) office for review between **February 1, 2018 and April 1, 2018**. Applications received after the April 1st deadline may only be considered if space is still available at the grade level at our school.
