When Should My Application Be Submitted?

- Applications for the 2025-2026 school year will be accepted from **September 1, 2024** through **May 30, 2025**.
- If the number of potential enrollees exceeds the capped enrollment limit +10%, a public lottery will be held to ensure equity in placement.
- Applications received <u>after</u> May 30, 2025 can be accommodated only until the
