COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

AJ 21 Criminal Justice in Society - 3 Units

Advisories: Ability to read at 12th grade level | This course introduces the characteristics of the US criminal justice system, particularly the structure and function of US police, courts, and corrections. Focus is placed on crime measurement, explanations of/responses to crime, components of the system, and current challenges. Students are introduced to the origins and development of criminal law, legal process, and sentencing and incarceration policies. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID AJ 110)

BUS 20 Introduction to Business - 3 Units

This course provides a multi-disciplinary understanding of how culture, society, economic systems, legal, international, political, financial institutions, and human behavior interact to affect a business organization's policy and practices within the U.S. and the global society. The course includes business organizational structure and design; leadership, human resource management, organized labor practices; marketing; organizational communication; technology; entrepreneurship; legal, accounting, financial practices; and the stock and securities market. (UC, CSU, C-ID BUS 110)

ECE 21 Child and Adolescent Development - 3 Units

This course examines the major physical, psychosocial, and cognitive/language developmental milestones for children, both typical and atypical, from conception through adolescence, with emphasis on interactions between maturational processes and environmental factors. Students will observe children, evaluate individual differences and analyze development characteristics. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID CDEV 100)

ENG 1B College Composition and Literature - 3 Units

Prerequisites: ENG 1A or ENG 2A with a grade of "C" or better | This course helps transfer students develop their critical thinking skills and read and write with college-level sophistication through writing analytical essays based on reading & discussing a culturally diverse literature. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID ENGL 120)

FCS 6 Nutrition - 3 Units

This course presents scientific concepts of nutrition related to the function of nutrients in basic life processes and current health issues. Emphasis is given to the role of food choices and physical activity on health, body weight, and risk of disease. Students undertake a self-study of personal dietary intake and habits compared to the Dietary Guidelines for Americans. (HBCU, UC, CSU)

H ED 1 Health Education - 3 Units

This course is designed to enhance the student's knowledge of a variety of health-related concepts and increase motivation and desire to take personal responsibility to achieve high level wellness. (HBCU, UC, CSU)

HIST 17B History of the United States - 3 Units

Advisories: Ability to read at the 12th grade level | This course surveys US history from Reconstruction to the present. Emphasis is on the political, economic, intellectual, and social forces which molded modern America. Topics include geographical regions encompassed by the US; racial, class, religious, and gender conflicts; immigration, politics, economics, culture, national identity. A study of California state and local government is included. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID HIST 140)

MUSIC 4 Exploring Music - 3 Units

This course is an exploration of growth and development of music from the 11th Century to the present. This course includes forms and styles used in Western art and surveys those factors influencing popular, rock, and commercial music as well as music used for live theater and in films. Not a music major course. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID MUS 100)

SPAN 1 Elementary Spanish 1 - 5 Units

Advisories: Ability to read at 12th grade level | This course is an introduction to the Spanish language and Spanish cultures/area studies. Emphasis is on communication skills (listening, speaking, reading, writing) and cultural understanding (behaviors, institutions, perspectives, artistic manifestations). Students will interact with authentic language in a cultural context. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID SPAN 100)

***SPAN 2 will be offered through Dual Enrollment in Summer 2024. Students who pass SPAN 1 in Spring can continue onto SPAN 2 in the Summer and complete their full year of foreign language.*
