Attention all students and staff who have not had their picture taken for IDs. The English classes will be going to The Spot on Wednesday and Thursday per a schedule. This Friday is our Back to School Dance. It is outside in the quad from 6-9pm and it is free. Come and have some fun with us and kick off the new school year right! Hope to see you there! Also this Friday will be our Back to School Rally hosted by the Stockton Kings. That rally will be on the football field at 8am.

If you have a job, you also need a Work Permit. It's against the law for a minor to work without a Work Permit in California. Work permits must be obtained at the start of a new job and renewed at the start of each new school year. *All current work permits, including those issued during the summer by CWA, expire on or before **Tuesday, August 14<sup>th</sup>**, and must be renewed.*

Students who have a job may be eligible to enroll in Work Experience Education, an elective course which combines paid employment with classroom instruction. Work Experience students meet with Ms. Yescas, our Work Experience Teacher/Coordinator, once a week at school and can earn up to 10 credits per semester and a total of 20 credits per year. If you are interested in finding a job, Ms. Yescas can assist you with job leads, creating a resume, and developing the skills you need to get and keep a job. If you need to renew your work permit or would like more information about Work Experience Education, stop by main office to see Ms. Yescas before school, during lunch or after school. The Work Experience office is located in the Counseling Center, across from Mrs. Klopstock.

Students who need sports physicals can pick up the paperwork at Healthy Start anytime before/after school or during lunch. Appointments will be scheduled once the paperwork has been submitted. Priority appointments will be given to students who are playing in a fall sport. Sports physical days are listed in the window at Healthy Start - Room E2
