SUSD Cohorts: must be live in-person instruction (not virtual)

- In order to receive authorization to begin any cohort, submit the Small Cohort Instruction proposal form to <u>Maylyn Paculba in State & Federal</u>.
- 2. Once site proposal is approved, State and Federal will generate Payroll Authorization.
- 3. Timesheets will be submitted electronically in the **Small Cohorts Google Folder** and processed by State and Federal department.
- Designate an arrival area for each cohort. Ensure student arrival area contains physical distancing markers, must wear a mask, reminder to wash hands, complete the Daily Symptom Check.
 - i. Health Care Assists will be screening cohort students.
 - b. Staff member leads the cohort to the classroom.
 - c. Designate a check in area for late students.
 - d. Teachers should begin with a daily health self-check reminder.
- 5. Designate a departure route to ensure student cohorts are separated at all times.
 - a. Staff member guides the cohort off campus.
- 6. **ProCare** Attendance system
 - a. Register all participants digitally through site-based application link.
 - b. Post QR code at check in area and facilitate contactless student check in/out.
 - c. Utilize messaging component for parent communication through **ProCare app**.
 - d. Access reporting for attendance/payroll requirements.
- 7. Designate an isolation area for students exhibiting symptoms while attending program and connect with Health Services for COVID support and contact tracing.
- 8. Communicate with staff members and participants regarding any cases of COVID-19 while maintaining confidentiality in accordance with the American Disabilities Act.
- 9. Designate student restroom area, ensure use is minimized to enforce social distancing rules.
- 10. Provide **Expectations for Families Letter** and **COVID Screening Letter** to all participants.
- 11. Review classroom sanitation/disinfectant procedures with custodial staff.
- Kinder and 1st grade: this is an opportunity to recover those lost students and build back SUSD enrollment numbers by providing cohorts.
- 13. Cohort participants will not intermix or congregate in any common areas on campus.
- 14. Students may not share items (must bring their own water bottles- SUSD has purchased water bottles for all students)
- 15. Review and practice cohort health/safety expectations and methods with participants.

All sites must adhere to the SUSD/STA MOU language:

- Administration must disclose cohort logistics to all staff. (email) Review school site plans highlighting health and safety procedures covered in site plans (online daily-symptom check vs. on-site check-in, student site/restroom access, PPE/sanitizer access, etc.) as well as general practical concerns such as student Chromebook access and administrative oversight.
- 2. Cohorts may take any of three formats below:
 - a. Credits-focused. Cohort engages in full-course makeup (such as in-person Cyber High / APEX) or another mechanism for multiple forms of credit accrual/recovery.
 - B. Growth-focused. Cohort teacher provides in-person supplemental instruction (to include direct instruction and interactive instruction) for attending students based on identified student needs (grade-level content mastery)
 - c. Differentiation-focused. Students who are already part of a self-contained class during the school day, then additionally attend as

Cohort Facts: In order to clarify cohorts to ensure standard messaging to all stakeholders.

- 1. All cohorts must occur outside of teacher work hours; this will generally occur after school for 1.5 to 2 hours (no later than 4:30pm) Teachers volunteer for additional compensation.
- Cohorts may consist of a maximum of 16 total individuals (including staff). So 15 kids and the teacher, or 14 kids and two rotating teachers, would be the hard-max. You can have this total number split up on different days but it cannot exceed a total of 16.
- 3. Administration will prioritize which students are in need of the cohort intervention; this is in consideration of the available volunteering teachers.
- 4. Schools have multiple options to design/configure cohorts based on common needs students may have and match them with the most appropriate teacher.
