## **AJ 21 Criminal Justice in Society - 3 Units**

*Advisories:* Ability to read at the 12<sup>th</sup> grade level.

This course introduces the characteristics of the criminal justice system in the US. Focus is placed on crime measurement, explanations of crime, responses to crime, components of the system, and current challenges to the system. The course examines the evolution of the principles and approaches of the justice system. (UC, CSU, C-ID AJ 110)

## **CS 11 Fundamentals of Computer Science - 3 Units**

This course is designed to introduce the student to the hardware, software, terminology, and uses of modern computer systems. Sociological, physiological, and psychological impacts of computers and technological changes are included. Computer programming and the use of word processing, electronic spreadsheets, database, and presentation software are introduced. (UC, CSU)

## **ECE 21 Child and Adolescent Development - 3 Units**

This course examines the major physical, psychosocial, and cognitive/language developmental milestones for children, both typical and atypical, from conception through adolescence. There will be an emphasis on interactions between maturational processes and environmental factors. While studying developmental theory and investigative research methodologies, students will observe children, evaluate individual differences and analyze characteristics of development at various stages. (UC, CSU, C-ID CDEV 100)

## **ENG 1B College Composition and Literature - 3 Units**

*Prerequisites:* ENG 1A Reading and Composition with a grade of "C" or better.

This course is designed to help the transfer student develop his/her critical thinking skills and read and write with college-level sophistication through writing analytical essays based on reading and discussing a culturally diverse literature. (UC, CSU, C-ID ENGL 120)

## **FCS 6 Nutrition - 3 Units**

*Advisories:* Ability to read at the 12<sup>th</sup> grade level.

This course presents scientific concepts of nutrition related to the function of nutrients in basic life processes and current health issues with emphasis on individual needs. Emphasis is given to the role of food choices and physical activity on health, body weight, and risk of disease. Students undertake a self-study of personal dietary intake and habits compared to the Dietary Guidelines for Americans. (UC, CSU)

## **H ED 1 Health Education - 3 Units**

This course is designed to enhance the student's knowledge of a variety of health-related concepts and increase motivation and desire to take personal responsibility to achieve high level wellness. (UC, CSU)

## **MUSIC 4 Exploring Music - 3 Units**

This course is an exploration of growth and development of music from the 11th Century to the present. This course includes forms and styles used in Western art and surveys those factors influencing popular, rock, and commercial music as well as music used for live theater and in films. This is not a music major course. (UC, CSU, C-ID MUS 100)

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
