Isolation Procedures for Positive Test Cases [CDPH]	<ul> <li>Isolate for at least 5 days, "Day 0" is the day of the positive viral test;</li> <li>Isolation can end after "Day 5" if symptoms are not present or are resolving and collected on Day 5 or later with a negative test (Staff)</li> <li>Antigen test recommended (home test kits available)</li> <li>Infected staff or students should wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings</li> <li>If unable to test, choosing not to test, or testing positive on Day 5 (or later), isolation can end after Day 10 if fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications</li> <li>If fever is present, isolation should be continued until 24 hours after fever resolves.</li> <li>If symptoms, other than fever, are not resolving, continue to isolate until symptoms are resolving or until after Day 10.</li> </ul>
Exposure – with symptoms	<ul> <li>Isolate and get tested within 3 – 5 days after last exposure</li> <li>Close contacts should wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings</li> <li>If you test positive after exposure please follow Isolation Procedures for Positive Test Cases</li> <li>If negative, return to school/work if – At least 24 hours have passed since resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications; AND Other symptoms are improving;</li> </ul>
Exposure – No symptoms	<ul> <li>Test within 3-5 days after last exposure.</li> <li>Per CDPH masking guidance, close contacts should wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings and when near those at higher risk for severe COVID-19 disease (see masking section below for additional information).</li> <li>If symptoms develop, test and stay home (see earlier section on symptomatic persons), AND</li> <li>If test result is positive, follow isolation for positive test results recommendations above</li> </ul>
