Guidance Technicians are on 8 high school sites in support of the site school counseling departments and career centers. In addition, they collaborate with the District School Counseling Department and post-secondary partners (including Delta College, Stanislaus State, and US military branches). Throughout the 2022-2023 school year, the Guidance Technicians provided assistance with: career exploration; assistance with financial aid, college, and scholarship applications; and notification and coordination of upcoming events such as workshops and field trips. These efforts and collaborations create multiple opportunities for students to learn about and apply to various post-secondary opportunities.

Most of the barriers they encountered this year involved the discrepancy between a high level of student interest in events and the slow increase of said events post-pandemic. Guidance Technicians worked with their partners to take full advantage of the opportunities that did come up. Another barrier we came across this year was the use of career center sign-in sheets, which makes data collection a very slow, tedious process. However, we are able to report that students are utilizing the career centers and participating in exploration opportunities at high levels. For example, Delta College is hosting a Preview Day in April, and the comprehensives are asking for additional spots due to the high level of interest from students grades 9-12.

As more opportunities open up for students, the Guidance Technicians have worked diligently to make sure students have access to participate in those events. In light of the realization that the use of career center sign-in sheets was a barrier, we are creating a digital, mainstream career center sign-in process for more accurate data collection.

Foster Youth, English learners, and socioeconomically disadvantaged high school students are provided support through the high school career centers by the Guidance Technicians.
