GENERAL INFORMATION

Adult education classes are open to persons 18 years of age and older, emancipated minors and pregnant or parenting minors.

ATTENDANCE: Students are expected to attend every class session. Hours missed for illness, tardiness, emergencies, etc., are all considered absences. **CANCELLATION OF CLASSES:** Classes may be cancelled due to funding or if attendance is below minimum levels.

COST: Career Technical Education and Senior Adults courses may require a "materials fee" for books or other necessary materials. These fees must be paid at the time of registration. No personal checks or credit cards are accepted and no refunds will be issued unless a class is cancelled.

COUNSELING SERVICES: Educational and career counseling is available through the Stockton School for Adults.

NONDISCRIMINATION: Stockton Unified School District programs and activities shall be free from discrimination based on gender, sex, race, age, color, religion, creed, ancestry, national origin, ethnic group identification, marital or parental status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, sexual orientation or the perception of one or more of such characteristics or any other unlawful consideration. ADULT SECONDARY EDUCATION High School Diploma - Graduation Requirements

To be eligible for a high school diploma a student must complete with passing grades the required course of study prescribed by the Stockton Unified School District Governing Board. Some credits may be earned through military experience or previous work experience. Physical education credits do not apply toward adult graduation requirements. Students must complete the Algebra I requirement (*Education Code 51224.5*). An adult education counselor reviews each prospective student's transcripts/records to determine the specific educational program. A minimum of five credits must be completed at Stockton School for Adults. Graduation requirements may change pending approval by the Board of Education.
