WOMEN'S CENTER-YFS PROGRAMS

Women's Center-Youth & Family Services is San Joaquin County's sole provider of free, confidential shelter and services specifically designed to meet the needs of homeless and runaway youth and victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking. Women's Center-YFS has a staff of 70 providing services at 10 sites throughout the county.

Shelter Programs

Women's Center-YFS operates two undisclosed emergency shelters for victims of domestic violence and their children in Stockton and Tracy. The agency operates two shelters for homeless and runaway youth in San Joaquin County. More than 700 women, children, men, and youth stay in our shelters each year.

Clinical Services

Licensed and license-eligible therapists offer therapy to adults, families, children, and youth, specializing in serving homeless and runaway youth and victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking.

Youth Drop-In Center

The Youth Drop-In Center provides at-risk youth ages 12-21 with a safe environment and access to laundry facilities, showers, hot meals, case management, individual and family therapy, and a wide range of supportive services.

EDUCATION AND OUTREACH



Promising Pathways - This program helps atrisk youth (16-25 years old) make a successful transition to adulthood. Staff help young people accomplish their goals for employment, education, housing, community involvement, and personal effectiveness/well-being.



Community Education - Women's Center-YFS offers presentations for local businesses, schools, faith-based organizations, service clubs, and community service providers. Presentations are available on Women's Center-YFS' services and the issues of domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, and youth homelessness.

Parenting Classes - Eight-week parenting classes and twelve-week co-parenting classes help parents and guardians develop their parenting skills, improve communication, reduce stress and family conflict, and learn about childhood growth and development, healthy boundaries, and positive disciplinary techniques.



Volunteer Training - The 67.5-hour Victim Assistance Training focuses on domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, and youth homelessness while preparing volunteers to assist victims during crisis and recovery.
