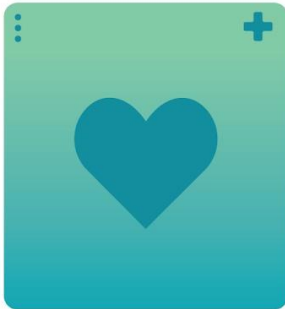
## Celebrations!
