





"A missed school day is a lost opportunity for students to learn. In this era of increased accountability for states, districts, and schools, the connection between student attendance and learning is being studied more than ever before." ~ National Center for Educational Statistics

- There is a high correlation between student attendance and student achievement
- Chronic student absenteeism reduces the ability for teachers to provide learning opportunities.
 - Chronic Truancy = 10% or more absenteeism
 - \circ There are 23 school day in August 23 x .10 (10%) = 2.3
- Every three (3) tardies count as an absences
- A student is also considered truant
 - Three unexcused absences
 - Three unexcused tardies
 - Three absences exceeding 30 minutes
