#### 3.0 Communications

3.1 Oral Suggestions and Comments From Members of the Community (At the beginning of the meeting persons wishing to speak will complete a card available at the door and submit to the Board secretary)

Rosslyn Halekakis, Teacher at Stagg HS, was happy to announce the demolition of the old portables that housed the young adults program is now complete. She thanked Ms. Silvia Cantu for being the voice and advocate for students and for staff. She was hoping new construction would begin in the same area were the portables once sat.

Der (Molly) Lor, Teacher at Huerta Elementary, spoke about PE at Huerta. PE is only held twice a week for a total of 16 minutes per week. Four teachers for the 2 days to instruct 240 students. Recently, campus security has been added but only to monitor water fountains. Teacher changed PE times because of the heat wave; other teachers were not allowing students to get water. She was told not to continue without permission. Ms. Lor filed a grievance for the PE ratio and student to teacher ratio. She now senses retaliation.

Jose Cantu, Teacher at Washington Elementary, spoke about MESA. He was asked to teach a MESA class all year. When he inquired about an account number to bill his time, he received an email (provided copy to the board) regarding an issue with the pay difference. He spoke to Dr. Gauna he was told everything was fine. A few days later the class was "taken away." Mr. Cantu feels that MESA can be kept as an elective even though Washington has a VAPA for 1 period.

Silvia Cantu, Vice President for STA, was there to represent the previous 2 speakers. At Huerta, the principal is violating Ed. Code section 51223 that would mean a minimum of 200 minutes of PE instruction every 10 days. Ms. Cantu wanted to notify the board that she has contacted the state regarding this and she has filed a uniform complaint with the district.

Ms. Cantu feels that at Washington school, the principal has always steered the ship and set the direction, except for this year. She stated her 6th graders have been in AVID, MESA and Program PLUS. This year there are none in her class. She feels that there is a lack of communication, leadership, and direction.

Ms. Cantu also stated that she filed a uniform complaint regarding the use of \$108 thousand dollars of LCFF for consulting Dr. Mary Hopewell. She feels the 3 administrators she has talked about in this comment have been trained and mentored by Dr. Hopewell, and feels that [these administrators] and their decisions haven't served the best interest of EL students nor schools.

Dellasa Do, Teacher at Washington, provided "thank you" notes to President Mendez on behalf of her students. She inquired about \$500 for supplies and what that money can be used for. Ms. Do wanted to clarify a previous comment made by Ms. Cantu regarding the AVID teacher at Washington school not having 6<sup>th</sup> graders in her class. Ms. Do is the AVID teacher at Washington and she stated there was a misunderstanding at the time of the schedule preparation for the AVID class that was later fixed and room was made for 6<sup>th</sup> graders and the option still stands to add 6<sup>th</sup> graders to the class. However, the 6<sup>th</sup> grade teacher has declined to add students to the AVID class.

Randy San Nicolas- President CSEA 821; Tamala Moore- CSEA 821 member; Rebecca Lopez- CSEA 821 member; Karen Amick- CSEA 821 member; and Maria Garcia- CSEA 821 member- All spoke regarding the CSEA contract. The need for a healthcare softcap and a raise in wages. They urged the board to settle the contract.

Albert Lopez, Senior at Weber; Abraham, Edison Student-Spoke to uplift Board Policy 9150 and encouraged student representatives to know their rights as students.

Scot and Karma McBrian- Mr. McBrian stated that he's asked numerous times for the district to maintain the intervention classes and programs that were started under Tom Anderson and no one has responded. Mr. McBrian stated the learning centers are non functional, push-in is not being used, and the assistants are not helping... we spent a million on a turnaround specialist only to not listen to them. Mr. McBrian urged the board to hold upper management accountable and put college students to work. He believes great things can come from this collaboration.
