6.1 Oral Suggestions and Comments from Members of the Governing Board

Ms. Kathleen Garcia, Trustee – Trustee Garcia welcomed everyone who attended the Board meeting. Trustee Garcia attended the funeral for Mr. Cameron Allison Jr., Lincoln High School student. She thanked Mr. Brian Biedermann and the Booster Club for donating 70 water bottles to the Lincoln High School football team. They also donated a blanket with Cameron's name on it and a \$250.00 visa gift card to Cameron's family. Edison High School extended an invitation to Trustee Garcia to attend thier pep rally.

Trustee Garcia attended the Human Trafficking Training held at the Professional Development Center. She also visited the Family Day at the Park event held at University Park on Saturday, September 16, 2017. Trustee Garcia was pleased to announce that 650 students attended the International Brotherhood of Electrical Worker (IBEW) event held on Friday, September 27, 2017 and 94 students were from Franklin High School.

Action Authorized by the Board

Ms. Angela Phillips, Vice President – Trustee Phillips thanked everyone involved with putting on the Ritz Carlton Customer Service Workshop. She was able to attend the afternoon session and she felt it was well worth the time.

Trustee Phillips urged Mr. Dan Wright to visit Huerta Elementary School to follow up on concerns voiced by Teachers. Trustee Phillips voiced her concerns regarding the Units of Study. She invited Mr. Erich Myers and others to attend the Curriculum Committee meetings to get more involved in discussions so that these type of issues can be resolved.

Dr. Andrea Burrise, Trustee – Dr. Burrise thanked the staff at Edison High School for hosting the HBCU College Expo. It was a great opportunity for students to learn more about other colleges located outside our area. Dr. Burrise attended the Expanding Your Horizons event held the University of the Pacific on Saturday, September 23, 2017. She also had an opportunity to attend an ACP training regarding Human Trafficking which was very informative.

Cecilia Mendez, Clerk/Trustee – Trustee Mendez thanked Mr. Eduardo Martir, Principal, Marshall Elementary School, Dr. Connor Sloan, Principal, Taylor Leadership Academy, Ms. Vendetta Brown, Principal, San Joaquin Elementary School, for inviting her to their school events.

Mr. Lange P. Luntao, Trustee – Trustee Luntao thanked Ms. Teresa Oden for attending the Board meeting to speak on behalf of board agenda item 8.1. Trustee Luntao spoke about the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program ending in the spring. He shared that Stockton Unified School District approved Resolution No. 16-29 in Support of a Safe Haven for All Students and Families in the Stockton Unified School District to establish that it is not SUSD's role to verify citizenship status nor share the information with anyone. Trustee Luntao informed everyone that DACA applications will be available for renewal until the end of next week which will extend a person's permit for the next two years. Trustee Luntao thanked the "Love Stockton" volunteers for helping El Dorado School clean up their garden. He also thanked Ms. Stephanie Matsumoto, Student Representative, for participating in the Board meeting. Trustee Luntao clarified that the Board of Education receives a \$795.00 stipend each month.

Mr. Steve Smith, Trustee – Trustee Smith attended the Ritz Carlton Customer Service Training. He also stated the Board of Education invested in the highest quality training for SUSD staff. Trustee Smith felt the training was short, concise, simple and easy to understand. He said there are 600 SUSD employees who have the best tool in their back pocket to help provide staff assistance, quality service, positive attitude, and professional appearance. Trustee Smith thanked the Board of Education and District staff for moving this forward.

Action Authorized by the Board

Ms. Maria Mendez, President – President Mendez thanked everyone for attending the Board meeting. President Mendez stated we should not put a price on the Units of Study or textbooks because we receive funding from State & Federal for these tools. The District should not worry about the cost of these tools as long as we provide them for our Teachers and students. She understands that SUSD is moving forward with new technology for the Units of Study and textbooks, however, many SUSD students may not have the resources to obtain internet access or electronic equipment at home. President Mendez feels that we need to continue to provide textbooks for our students in order for them to achieve academically with the homework. If our student achievement goes down the California Department of Education will not provide the funding we need to help our students. Without the proper funding the District may need to cut positions and it will be the Boards responsibility to monitor what positions to keep. She also stated if AB 1250 passes it may hurt the District financially so we need to be very mindful. President Mendez said we need to provide the best customer service training so that SUSD employees can be the best. In order for us to continue to keep our numbers for student enrollment we need to go above and beyond. The Ritz Carlton Customer Service Training is a useful tool for us to use. President Mendez was happy to see Board Members and Administrators in attendance. She stated the Board of Education's responsibility is to follow the five W's (Who, What, When, Where, Why) and SUSD staff are responsible for the "How" in order to resolve issues and matters within Stockton Unified School District.

7.0 Superintendent

7.1 Superintendent's Report

Mr. Dan Wright, Acting Superintendent, attended the Ritz Carlton Customer Service Training held at the Stockton Arena. The highlight of the training was the video about Bob Farrell the owner of Farrell's Restaurant and Ice Cream Parlour.

Mr. Wright, Ms. Sharon Barnes and Ms. Nicolette Gonzaba attended the Education Trust West 1st Annual Equity Forum held in San Diego, CA. They were able to see some of the work that Long Beach, San Jose and San Diego school districts are doing. All three of these school districts have adopted the A-G as their graduation requirement. Mr. Wright stated this task is something SUSD needs to strive towards in the near future.

Mr. Wright spoke about the UCAN Conference held at Edison High School. 500 students attended the event and over \$141,000.00 in financial aid was offered to students. 6 students received full scholarships to attend college and 70 students received college acceptance letters.
