I volunteered my time and built ties between school staff, departments, schools, parents and families. And in all these efforts I always took the opportunity to practice my English.

My message to parents is: Get involved in your child's school so that the teachers know you, the students can smile at you and call you by name. When you are volunteering at their schools your children are proud to see you there supporting them not only when you are present at awards ceremonies but also at school events. You will see on their faces how proud they feel to have the support of their parents and with a smile on their lips they tell their classmates, **"That's my mom!"**
