Program Offerings:

- A place to connect. Youth connect with other kids and adult counselors from across the country. All participants and facilitators have been impacted by parental incarceration.
- A place to share. Youth can talk about their experience (if they want), in a community free of judgment.
- A place to give back. Youth may apply to become Junior Counselors, where they may find joy in supporting others.
- Oh yeah, it's FUN! We believe that play is necessary to build relationships and communities. While this group does address a serious issue, it is also serious fun!

To Participate, youth must:

- Be between the ages of 10-15
- Have a parent who is or was incarcerated
- Be aware of the parent's incarceration
- Have internet and device access during scheduled group times
- · Commit to attending all 6 community meetings
